VII. Public Comment

- a. Graduation Concerns - Gianna Spatola, Student (Senior student expecting to graduate in Spring)
 - i. Gianna: Graduation at prudential center but everyone who attends needs to be vaccinated and get a booster. Hopefully we can figure something out so we all can attend (us and our parents). Maybe we can do an outside graduation like we've done in the past.
 - ii. President Patel: Thank you. I didn't think about the graduating seniors who would not be able to walk at the Prudential. If anyone has anything to add, I encourage it. I'm not sure what the solution can be but I want to talk to President Jebb to see alternatives and what can be done. We all deserve to walk at commencement.
 - iii. Secretary of Fraternity and Sorority Life Jiji Lindsey: Would you prefer if the vaccinated and boosted students were to walk at prudential and others to have their own ceremony if possible?
 1. Gianna: I wish we could all walk together. Or if we did an outside graduation where we had unvaccinated wear a mask and vaccinate don't have to. I would do whatever just to walk.

- iv. Secretary of Diversity & Inclusion Cristina Navarette Carpizo: I thought that anyone unvaccinated can walk around and be on campus.
 - 1. President Patel: Prudential Center has specific rules. (It is not an on-campus location).
 - v. Graduate School Senator Andy: Every senior deserves the right to walk.
 - vi. Senator Weina: I have friends also graduating and I feel like personally everyone should walk together. My roommate was not vaccinated and went through a few processes to be on campus and has to get tested every week. That's the policy for every student and staff at ramapo who are unvaccinated. Is there a way that everyone there who is unvaccinated can get tested prior to the ceremony so we can ensure that everyone can walk and be there.
 - 1. Dr. Brown: Point of information - this is governed by the facilities and city of Newark. That is not in Ramapo's control.
 - 2. Weina: Is Prudential a set location?
 - 3. Dr. Brown: That's what we're trying to figure out. The Prudential Center's rules are something that we can not control.
 - vii. VP Paolo: Prudential center has a medical exemption piece of their website. If that applies there is a process that you can go to which requires an online form, submitting certain evidence, and providing proof of a medical test before coming. [Here](#) is the link to the website where it discusses policies and exemptions.
 - 1. Gianna: Issue is that it has to be approved. I had a medical excuse for Ramapo and it got denied. Also people who don't want to be vaccinated can't get a medical excuse.
 - viii. Graduate School Senator Andy: Try again for another medical exemption. For those who choose not to get vaccinated I think the separate ceremonies are the best idea.
 - ix. Senate President Witte: I can definitely meet with the Dean of Students to try to figure this out because her office is coordinating a lot of the commencement. Our meeting is next Thursday at 1pm.
 - x. Secretary of D&I Cristina: If it's people who just don't want to get the vaccine it's asking for everyone to accommodate them. It's unfair to ask everyone to comply with them just because they don't want to get vaccinated. it's not fair for people who are at risk to be at close contact with someone who is not vaccinated.
 - xi. Secretary of PR Dylan Solis: I think in the past two years we've figured out how to keep people distanced and safe at events. We can definitely find and implement a solution to this to keep people safe and let people walk.
